<u>Credit Recovery</u> - Students are required to pass 24 credits of coursework to receive a diploma. Each semester class is worth half of a credit, and to receive credit students must earn a grade of a D or above. Your student should earn 7.5 credits a year if they pass all of their classes. If students do not pass a class, they need to make up the half-credit they failed. Please review the attached report card with your child and celebrate success! Post-Secondary Options at WHS - At Wahkiakum High School, our goal is to provide students with the skills necessary to succeed in all post-secondary options. Students can stay on campus and earn college credits through both Central Washington University and Lower Columbia College. Taking these classes on our campus instead of through Running Start is 100% free and allows students to remain a part of our high school culture. Taking advanced and honors courses at WHS is a student's choice. If students take full advantage of College in the High School during their 11th and 12th grade years, they could graduate with 25-40+ college credits! We also offer trade school credit through LCC for Ag Mechanics and Industrial Math, giving students a head start in LCC's welding program. In addition, we offer a variety of STEM classes through lab sciences, computer programming, engineering and Career and Technical Education (CTE) classes that prepare students for a variety of post-secondary options including the workforce, the trades, internships, apprenticeships, the military and college. Junior and senior year is for exploring career interests and trying new things!

<u>School Supplies</u> - Organization is key to success! These skills are learned and require practice. We will provide all students with a planner on the first day of school but all other supplies need to be purchased. *Students should come to school on the first day with a three-ring binder, dividers, notebook paper, 2-3 composition books, a pencil pouch, pencils, pens, highlighters, note cards, colored pencils, glue sticks and scissors.* If taking a PE class, students are required to have PE shoes, shorts/athletic pants and a t-shirt. Starting the school year prepared pays off! Please contact the office if you need help obtaining supplies. We also welcome donations to help others.
